### **Chatbox questions and answers:**

Q: Do you recommend sending parents a questionnaire to ask how often they would like communication from teachers?

A: (from Tabatha) My advice for questionnaires is to not send too many - families are overwhelmed with communication. If that can be a part of a beginning of the year



questionnaire that asks any relevant question, absolutely do that! It's an important question! I also believe in just setting the standard, like a weekly 1:1 with families and a weekly class meeting, something like that. They can sign up for extra during your "office hours." I often use sign-up genius for things like that. It's free and so helpful!

Q: Any suggestions for how to celebrate birthdays remotely?

A: (from Tabatha) For Birthdays - I sent home a birthday crown and bubbles and every week we celebrated the birthdays by singing and dancing and letting the birthday kid have a special show and tell.
