
Virtual Coaching as a Professional Learning Strategy

Historical Context

- The effective use of video to guide reflection and feedback in educator programs has been researched since the 1960s (Rich & Hannafin, 2009; Lewis & Jones, 2019).
- The first step is to build comfortability with being observed and coached remotely. COVID-19 has been a disruptor/innovator in this regard.




Self-Efficacy






